## **Explorers**

Our topic this term is Explorers. We will be learning about the people whose journeys changed the world, developing new trade routes, mapping uncharted territory and securing their places in history.



In English we will writing exciting adventure stories which encapsulate the spirit of discovery. This year we will be reading the same text each term as a class, sharing our enjoyment of these books together as we read them regularly. We will be studying biographies of key figures and events as well as compiling our own. Narrative poetry about travel will encourage children to compare different forms of exploration and interpret these.

In Maths children will be developing their problem-solving strategies using visual methods such as bar modelling to help tackle complex problems. We will be making links to the topic, comparing distances between places using maps. Number fluency remains a focus, so children can apply their number facts confidently when calculating.

In History and Geography we will be conducting orienteering lessons around the school grounds and local area. Children will be learning about an ancient civilisation and the impact of 'colonisation' on the indigenous people. Our visit to the Cutty Sark & The National Maritime Museum will give us a good understanding of 'The Great Tea Race', the importance of trade routes and what life was like at sea.

In Science we will be learning about how light travels and how it is received. The children will plan investigations to collect evidence that will answer their questions about the properties of light. They will lay out their findings in the form of diagrams, presentations to their classmates and in a formal written format.

In DT and Art we will developing our sketching techniques, using a range of materials to represent story settings. We will examine the changes to product design that led to developments in travel and the equipment explorers use.



In Computing, children will be creating animations linked to their topic, as well as maths calculation 'help videos' for our families to refer to when learning at home.

In PE, children will take part in Tag Rugby and Dance this term, developing their coordination, accuracy and balance.
